

## General information

Keep medicines locked up and out of the reach and sight of children.

Medicines are an important part of your treatment.

Each medicine has been individually prescribed for you. Take your medicines as instructed on your medicine label. Taking more will not make them work faster and may harm you.

To avoid problems, please do not change or stop any medicine without talking to your doctor or pharmacist first.

If you feel that any problems you are having could be caused by your medicines or if you have any questions about your medicines, please contact your doctor, pharmacist or nurse.

Please add any medicines you have bought to the list on the other side of this page including herbal, homeopathic and Chinese remedies.

Always check with your doctor or pharmacist before starting any new medicine as it could be harmful.

Take care of your medicines - always keep them in a closed container and in a cool, dry place. Never transfer medicines from the original container to another.

Only take medicines that have been prescribed for you. Do not use medicine that has been prescribed for anyone else as it could harm you. Do not share your medicine with anyone else as it could harm them.

Remember to contact your doctor before your prescription has run out to obtain further supplies.

If medicines are not used, do not hoard them. Take them to a pharmacy for safe disposal.

**Remember - if in doubt talk to your pharmacist.**
