Summary of Committee Business				
The fourth meeting of the Committee took place on 18 August 2025. At the meeting, the Trust's 2024/25 Public Authority Statutory Equality and Good Relations Duties Annual Progress Report was discussed and approved for submission to Trust Board. The Committee continued its discussion regarding the question of branding its work and future projects. Ms Jo Edgar, NHSCT Corporate Communications, agreed to meet with Mr Will Nicholson, Better Way Network / STEPS in order to discuss the issue further. She will report back to the Committee at its next meeting. Ms Jayne McReynolds, NHSCT, provided the Committee with an update on the Northern Area Integrated Partnership Board, outlining its purpose and progress to date. Ms Alix Crawford, Mae Murray Foundation, made a presentation to the Committee on the subject of partnership working. She outlined some projects and initiatives which she had been developing in partnership with Trust managers and highlighted their successes and challenges. Ms Claire Green, NHSCT, made a presentation to the Committee on the subject of Population Health and Ageing Well, based on the Take 5 Steps to Stay Well model. The Committee discussed which two geographical areas within the Trust it would select as sites for population health pilot projects. Ms Jayne McReynolds reported back to the Committee, on a meeting of its Reference Group, which had taken place on 6 August. The members of the Reference Group had recommended that The Sperrins should be chosen to implement the rural pilot project and Antrim Town, the urban project. The Committee members agreed with the selection of these two areas. The date of the next meeting of the Committee will be agreed. The final minutes will be tabled for noting at a future Trust Board meeting after approval by the Committee.

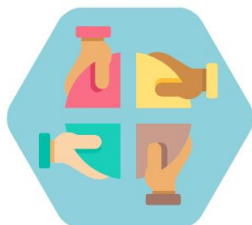
